Snow Driving Safety

Oregon weather is unpredictable - especially these last couple years. Here are some tips on what to do if the unexpected happens this winter!

My Front Tires Skid:

1. Take your foot off the gas and shift to neutral
2. Don't try to steer immediately
3. As the wheels skid and the vehicle slows, steer in the direction you want to go.
4. At this point, you can put the vehicle back into "drive" and gently accelerate.
5. If you have anti-lock brakes, apply steady pressure.
6. Don't worry if you feel your anti-lock brakes pulse - this is normal.

My Rear Tires Skid:

1. Take your foot off the accelerator.
2. Steering in the direction you want the front wheels to go.
3. If your rear tires are skidding to the left, steer left to regain control.
4. If you have standard brakes, pump them gently.
5. IF you have anti-lock brakes, apply steady pressure.
6. Don't worry if you feel your anti-lock brakes pulse - this is normal.

You Get Stuck:

1. Don't spin your wheels, it will only dig you in deeper.
2. With a shovel, clear snow away from the wheels and the underside of the car.
3. Turn your wheels from side to side to push snow out of the way.
4. Use a light touch on the gas to ease your car out.
5. Pour sand, kitty litter, gravel, or salt in the path of the wheels.
6. Try putting your vehicle in a lower gear - it may help.

SLOW COOKER CINNAMON ROLL MONKEY BREAD

8-10 SERVINGS

TOTAL TIME: 2 hours 20 minutes

PREP TIME: 20 minutes

COOK TIME: 2 hours

INGREDIENTS:

2 cans Grands! Cinnamon Rolls (5 per can)

1/4 cup granulated sugar

1 teaspoon cinnamon

1/2 cup brown sugar

1/2 cup unsalted butter, melted



DIRECTIONS:

Open each can of cinnamon rolls. Reserve the icing. Cut each rolls into 6 pieces.

Place the granulated sugar and cinnamon in a gallon size Ziploc bag. Add the cut up cinnamon rolls (the pieces will fall apart a little) to the bag. Seal and shake to coat the pieces with cinnamon sugar.

Stir together the brown sugar and melted butter.

Spray a 5-7 Qt slow cooker with nonstick cooking spray. Place half the dough pieces in the bottom of the slow cooker. Pour half the melted butter mixture over the top, then add the rest of the cinnamon roll pieces and the rest of the melted butter.

Cover the slow cooker and cook on high power for about 2 hours. (Check it at one hour, then again at one and a half hours, just to be safe.) The edges will start to brown, but the top will still be a little gooey looking. Turn off the slow cooker and let sit for 5 minutes before serving.

Optional: Drizzle the icing that came with the rolls over the top of the monkey bread in the crockpot, or pour it over like syrup after serving.

Note: Not all slow cookers are created equal. Mine has a high 4 hour setting and that is what I cooked mine on.

Note: The monkey bread will stick as it cools. Serve from the warm slow cooker and make sure that you take it all out before it cools all the way or it'll require soaking.

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Random Knowledge - Snow Addition

- Winter cold kills more than twice as many Americans as summer heat does.
- Chionophobia is the persistent fear of snow, especially becoming trapped by snow. The term is derived from the Greek words chion and phobos, meaning "snow" and "fear," respectively .
- Every winter, at least one septillion (that's 1 followed by 24 zeros) snow crystals fall from the sky.
- The largest recorded snowman ever built was in Bethel, Maine, in February 1999. The 113-foot, 7-inch snowman broke the previous record held by Yamagata, Japan, at 96 feet and 7 inches.
- Around 12% of Earth's land surface is covered in snow and ice.
